# TO THE MEMBERS OF GX GLASS SALES & SERVICES LTD

# Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **GX GLASS SALES & SERVICES LTD ("the Company")**, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2015, the Statement of Profit and Loss, the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

# Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provision of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting the frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of internal financial control, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement. An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Company's preparation of the financial statements that give true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by Company's Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

# Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements, give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- a) In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2015;
- b) In the case of the Statement of Profit and Loss, of the loss for the year ended on that date; and
- c) In the case of the Cash Flow Statement, of the cash flows for the year ended on that date.

# **Emphasis of Matters**

We draw attention to the following matters in the Notes to the financial statements:

- The Company's net worth has been completely eroded. The Company has incurred a
  net loss during the current year and has been incurring losses in the previous years
  as well. Further the current liabilities have exceeded the current assets. However
  the financial statements have been prepared on the fundamental assumption of
  going concern for the reasons stated in Note No. 1 (a) (iii)forming part of these
  financial statements.
- Refer Note 2.26 forming part of these financial statements, The Company had an
  order from the Central Government requiring it to recover a sum of INR 57,55,173
  from one of its directors against excess remuneration paid in earlier years. While the
  Company has reversed the transaction in the financial statements, as per the
  Management the actual recovery shall take place in the next financial year.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.

# Report on other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- a) As required by the Companies (Auditors Report) Order, 2015 ("the Order) issued by the Central Government of India in terms of Section 143(11) of the Act, we give in the Annexure, a statement on the matters specified in paragraphs 3 & 4 of the Order.
- b) As required by section 143(3) of the Act, we report that:
  - a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit.
  - b) In our opinion proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as appears from our examination of those books
  - c) The Balance Sheet, the Statement of Profit and Loss, and Cash Flow Statem dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account.

- d) In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014.
- e) The going concern matter as mentioned above under the Emphasis of Matters paragraph above, in our opinion, does not have any adverse effect on the functioning of the Company for the reasons stated therein.
- f) On the basis of written representations received from the directors as on 31 March, 2015, taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31 March, 2015, from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164(2) of the Act.
- g) With respect to the other matters included in the Auditor's Report and to our best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:
- i. The Company has disclosed the impact of pending litigations on its financial position in its financial statements Refer Note 2.23 to the financial statements;
- ii. The Company did not have any long term contracts including derivative contracts for which there were any material foreseeable losses.

iii. There were no amounts required to be transferred to Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Company.

# Referred to in paragraph 1 under Report on other Legal & Regulatory requirements section of our Report of even date

- a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including quantitative details and situation of fixed assets.
  - b) The Company has a regular program of physical verification of its fixed assets through which all fixed assets are verified, in a phased manner over a period of three years. In our opinion, this periodicity of physical verification is reasonable having regard to the size of the Company and the nature of its assets. As informed to us, no material discrepancies were noticed on such verification as carried out under the above program during the current year.
- ii. a) The inventories except goods in transit have been physically verified during the year by the management. In our opinion the frequency of such verification is reasonable.
  - b) In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the procedures of physical verification of inventories followed by the management are reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the company and the nature of its business.
  - c) On the basis of our examination of the records of inventories, we are of the opinion that the Company has maintained proper records of inventories and the discrepancies noticed on such verification between physical stocks and book records were not material.
- iii. The Company has not granted any loans, secured or unsecured tocompanies, firms or other parties covered in the register maintained under Section 189 of the Companies Act, 2013 as per information and explanations given to us. Consequently the provisions of clauses 3(iii)(a) and (iii)(b) of the Order are not applicable.
- iv. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there are adequate internal control procedures commensurate with the size of the Company and nature of its business for purchase of inventory and fixed assets and for sale of goods & services. During the course of our audit we have not observed any major weakness in such internal control system.
- As the company has not accepted any deposits from the public, the provisions of clause
   3 (v) of the Order are not applicable.
- vi. The Company is not required to maintained cost records as prescribed by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 148 of the Companies Act 2013.
  - a) According to the information and explanations given to us and the records of the company examined by us, the company has been generally regular in depositing undisputed statutory dues, including Provident Fund, Employees' State Insurance, Income Tax, Sales Tax, Service Tax, Duty of Customs, Duty of Excise, Value Added Tax, Cess, and other material statutory dues with the appropriate authorities during the year.

The Company has not deposited service tax on reverse mechanism during the year which been outstanding for more than six months as at the financial year end.

b) There are no dues with respect to income tax, sales tax, wealth tax, service tax, duty of custom, duty of excise, value added tax and cess that have not been deposited with the appropriate authorities on account of any dispute other than those mentioned below:-

- viii. The accumulated losses of the company as at the end of the financial year are more than 50% of its net worth. The company has incurred cash loss of INR 259.91Lacs(Previous Year: INR 185.16Lacs)during the current year.
- ix. According to the records of the Company examined by us and on the basis of information and explanations given to us, the Company has not defaulted in term loan repayment of dues to financial institutions. The company has not obtained any borrowings from banks and by way of debentures.
- x. The Company has not provided any guarantee during the year.
- xi. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, term loans have been applied for the purpose for which they were raised.
- xii. During the course of our examination of the books of account carried out in accordance with the generally accepted auditing practices in India, we have not come across any instance of the fraud on or by the Company nor we have been informed by the company of such instances being noticed or reported during the year.

# 1. Significant Accounting policies:

#### a) Basis of Accounting

- i) The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on accrual basis of accounting to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions thereof.
- ii) The net worth of the Company has been eroded and the accumulated losses of the Company are Rs. 9,78,16,162/- as against the Paid up Capital of Rs 3,53,50,000/-. However the accounts have been prepared on the fundamental assumption of going concern concept based on the following.
  - 1. The Company is a subsidiary of Asahi India Glass Ltd, the integrated glass manufacturer in India and has been receiving active support therefrom.
  - The Company has been in operation for less than five years and according to management these are initial losses incurred primarily to establish and promote business.
  - 3. The Company is having a healthy Gross Margin of the 31%.
  - The Company is into an expansion mode as it has:
    - Increased its geographical presence by opening a branch in Panchkula in the year 2013-14, and
    - In addition to Gurgaon has opened another sale cum experience center in West Delhi and another sale cum experience Center in South Delhi is also under construction which will become operational in the year 2015-16.

#### b) Fixed Assets

Both tangible and intangible assets are stated at cost of acquisition or construction, less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all expenses related to acquisition and installation of the concerned assets as well as related proportionate share of expenses incurred.

Office building on lease comprise of cost of additions and alteration carried out on leased premises.

Capital works in progress includes expenditure incurred till date of balance sheet on assets under construction / installation and capital advances made.

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#### c) Depreciation

#### **Tangible Assets**

Pursuant to the notification of Schedule II of The Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs effective 01-04-2014, depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight Line Method (SLM) as per useful life and in manner prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013. The company has accounted for higher depreciation charge of Rs.12,34,677/- in the results for the year ended March 31st' Mar 2015 and additional charge of Rs. 2,98,894/- in reserves in terms of transitional provisions of the said Schedule-II. Had the company continued with the previously assessed useful lives, charge for depreciation for the year ended March 31st Mar 2015, would have been lower by Rs. 12,34,677/- and the loss for the year would have been lower by the same amount.

# **Intangible Assets**

Intangible asset are amortized over a period of five years on a pro-rata basis.

#### **Leasehold Assets**

Leasehold assets are depreciated over the period of lease.

#### d) Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. The bases of determining cost for various categories of inventories are follows:

Stores, Spares Parts and Consumables

First in First out based on actual cost

Traded Goods

First in First Out based on actual cost

Material in Transit

At actual cost

Scrap/waste

Estimated net realizable value

# e) Revenue Recognition

Sales are recognized as soon as goods are dispatched to customer and are stated net of returns, trade discounts, trade taxes etc.

Revenue with regard to services is recognized once the same are rendered.

Revenue with regard to ongoing projects is recognized based on percentage completion of work.

#### f) Cost of Material and Stores Consumed

Cost of traded goods and Stores is worked out by adding opening stock to purchase and reducing closing stock therefrom.

#### g) Employees Benefit

Contribution to Defined Contribution Scheme such as Provident Fund, ESIC, etc. are charged to the Profit and Loss Account as incurred.

The liability for gratuity at the end of each financial year is determined on the basis of actuarial valuation carried out by the actuary on the basis of projected unit credit method as confirmed to the Company. Profits and losses arising out of actuarial valuations are recognized in the Profit and Loss Account as income or expense.

The liability is provided based on the number of days of unutilized leave at each balance sheet date on the basis of actuarial valuation using projected unit credit method.

Liability on account of short term employee benefits comprising largely of compensated absences, bonus and other incentives is recognized on an undiscounted accrual basis.

Termination benefits are recognized as an expense in the Profit and Loss Account.

#### h) Taxes on Income

Current Tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred Tax is recognized on timing differences; being the difference between the taxable incomes and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred Tax Assets subject to the consideration of prudence are recognized and carried forward only to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such Deferred Tax Asset can be realized. The tax effect is calculated on the accumulated timing difference at the year end based on the tax rates and laws enacted or substantially enacted on the Balance Sheet date.

# i) Operating Lease

The company has taken office building and warehouses and recognized as operating lease and the rentals thereon are charged to Profit and Loss Account. The lease agreements are usually renewed by mutual consent on mutually agreeable terms.
